



Thank you again for ordering your new Tumbleweed Chandelier with Sand+Suede. With the proper unpacking and care, your chandelier will remain intact and beautiful for years to come.

Some basic tips for unpacking:

**Garden gloves are your friend.** Tumbleweeds are basically made of a billion burr jacks on a branch system and these little guys are painful when they get stuck in your skin.

**Unwrap carefully.** The tumbleweed has been placed inside a bag to keep the packing peanuts out of the plant. The cord is attached, but has been fished through a hole at the bottom of the bag to keep it from rubbing directly against the tumbleweed during shipping. Carefully lift the bagged tumbleweed from the box. Find a place to hang it so that you can cut the plastic bag off. Attempting to pull the bag off the tumbleweed may result in breakage and is not recommended. Wrapping the cord a few times around a shower curtain rod should hold it in place long enough to remove the bag, or you can have a friend hold the chandelier by the cord while you cut the bag. Some debris in the bottom of the bag is normal.

**Tumbleweeds are hearty, but they aren't indestructible.** Please be gentle when moving the chandelier. If you can't hang it in right away, find an area where you can gently place it on a flat surface where it will be undisturbed by pets, kids, or strong winds or rain.

**I recommend a vintage style filament CFL bulb.** Edison makes a really nice one that casts an amber glow. Your tumbleweed has been treated with a UL rated flame retardant spray, but I still I do not recommend using any standard filament bulbs, as they produce an amount of heat that could pose a potential fire hazard.
